



## Finding Full Text Sources: PEP, PsycARTICLES, Ehrman E-Resources

Two databases containing full-text articles of the psychosocial literature are available:

1. **PEP – the Psychoanalytic Electronic Publishing Archive**
2. **PsycARTICLES** from the American Psychological Association

Another very important source for finding full-text books and journal articles is the Ehrman Medical Library's **Electronic Resources** links on the library homepage.

### PEP – the Psychoanalytic Electronic Publishing Archive

PEP contains the full-text of eleven major psychoanalytic journals from 1920-2000, as well as the Bulletins of the American Psychoanalytic Association, and the International Psychoanalytical Association. Twenty-three classic psychoanalytic books are available full-text, including works of Bion, Klein, and Winnicott.

### Searching PEP

PEP can be searched by book and article author, title, journal title, and full-text from all the articles of the journals in this database.

A frame with drop down menus is available on the left side of the database window for browsing. The tables of contents are provided for all the psychoanalytic journal titles, a list of the books is arranged alphabetically by author, and there is a separate alphabetical list of journal article authors in these drop-down menus, plus a separate **Search tab**  on the top of the page which opens the PEP search engine.

### Journal Search

- Select "Table of Journals and Books" from the left side window frame.
- Select the journal title from the resulting list to browse the tables of contents. OR
- Click the **Search tab** and type one of these journal codes into the **Journal Code** box on the search screen:

## Author Search

- Select "Table of Authors" from the left side window frame.
- Select the name of the author from the resulting list in the left side window frame in the table of authors by clicking on the first letter of the alphabet of the author's last name. OR
- Click on the **Search Tab** and enter in the "Author Name" Search box

## Title Search

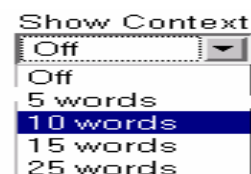
- Click on the **Search Tab** and enter the title of the article or book in the "Article Title" search box.
- Check the list of book titles in the left window frame under "Non Series Books"

## Word Search (to search for words anywhere within an article)

- Click on the **Search tab**.
- Type in the words in the first Search box.
- Use quotes for phrases.
- Select a radio button other than the default button of "Article" to specify a particular context of the word in either a quotation, dream, dialog, a reference from the bibliography, or from a particular paragraph so that all the words in the search term must be within 25 words of each other.
- Terms retrieved are highlighted in yellow

## Displaying Results

- Search results may be "Ranked" by changing the default in the Search tab to Ranked. Ranked searches set the order of the search so that the most relevant results retrieved from the highest number of matches are listed at the top of the list.
- "Show Context" pull-down option on the Search box shows more than the default bibliographic information in the results list, for example, selecting 10 words shows 10 words of the article context before and after each match in the results list .



## Disconnecting

Click on the **Log Out tab**  in the top menu.

## PsycARTICLES

PsycARTICLES™ is a database of full-text articles from journals published by the American Psychological Association, the APA Educational Publishing Foundation, the Canadian Psychological Association, and Hogrefe & Huber. There are currently 52 journal titles included which go back to 1985 for full text, unless other dates are noted. The current journal title list is available at <http://www.apa.org/psycarticles/covlist.html>. The database allows for browsing the journal tables of contents and also provides a separate search engine to search many fields of the full-text.

## Connecting to PsycARTICLES

## Searching PsycARTICLES

1. Browse all the journals in the database by alphabetical title or browse by the journal titles in one of these categories: General Topics, Basic Research, Applied & Practice, Health/Mental Health, Social/Personality, Development, Education, Professional Issues & Public Policy, Theory, Reviews, Methodology
2. Use the PsycARTICLES Search boxes to do a Quick Search via keywords with the capacity to use Boolean operators
3. Do a Field Restricted Search to search for full text from one of these fields: Author, Title, Source, Subject, Abstract, Index Terms, Keywords, Language, Population Group, Age Group, Form/Content Type, Classification Codes. Three search fields may be combined using the Boolean AND, OR
4. Search by Journal via the drop-down menu of journal titles combined with a search term and a specific issue and year

## Displaying and Printing


To display search results, click on "Printer Friendly Version."

Full-text is available in html format and/or pdf.

The best place to look for holdings for full text electronic journals and books is the All Electronic Resources link on the Library homepage at <http://library.med.nyu.edu/library/eresources/index.html>.
